The results are a fresh approach to his abstract work, “Neo-Expressionism”, hints of Urban-Pop art and bits of Cubism are all thrown into the mix. His paintings are modern, fresh and powerfully enticing. A Ring Master of colorful images and wild imaginings which are a result of his life altering accident, Emilio gives the message of hope, redemption, a fighting spirit and secrets of the human heart.
